Sean Tarry's charge had closed out his juvenile season in similar vein when bolting home by five lengths in the Gr.3 Umkhomazi Stakes at Greyville. Already Gr.1-placed, courtesy of a third in the Gold Medallion, the colt looks set to make plenty of noise at three this season.

Bred at Drakenstein and a R1,1 million graduate of the Cape Premier Yearling Sale, Chimichuri Run is out of Gr.1 SA Fillies Classic heroine Spiced Gold, who foaled a full brother to the dual Gr.3 winner in 2017.

Grandam Little Legend, an own sister to the stakes winner Main Warrior, is a grandaughter of the Koster-bred Haiti (Oligarchy), who won both the Natalia and Flamboyant Stakes.

Age trumped youth when eight-year-old CAPTAIN ALDO upstaged Mike de Kock's fancied sophomores Alyaasaat and Soqrat.

Allowed to dictate matters, St John Gray's blinkered eight-year-old bravely stuck to his guns to repel a late surge from Alyaasaat by a head, whilst last season's champion juvenile only found his best stride too late and finished a length back in third.

This was a tenth career success for the veteran, who enjoyed his most fruitful season at age five with victories in the Gr.2 Hawaii Stakes and Listed Wolf Power 1600. The dual Gr.2 winner has been a wonderful moneyspinner for Gray and co-owner Aldo Girolo, rewarding them with earnings fast approaching R1.5-million.

Bred at Boland Stud, he is the third of a trio of three stakes performers out of Cuddle Me, all of whom were trained by Gray. Sportscuddle (Sportsworld) won the Gr.2 Gerald Rosenberg and two renewals of the Gr.3 Jacaranda Handicap, whilst Glorious Jet (Jet Master) was runner-up in all of the Gr.2 Colorado King Stakes, Gr.2 Charity Mile and Wolf Power 1600. The mare's seven winners from nine runners also include the stakes-placed Var filly Cup Cake.

Cuddle Me is a half-sister to a pair of Gr.1-placed performers; Gr.2 Rex Trueform Fillies Championship winner and Gr.1 Golden Slipper third Another Cuddle (Volcanic) and Computaform Sprint runner-up Another Minstrel (Northern Guest).

This was a third Graded success for the daughter of High Chaparral, to go along with victories in the aforementioned Yellowwood and Gr.3 London News Stakes.

Now successful in six of eight starts, the Irish import is out of Janoubi, an unraced half-sister to multiple French graded stakes winner and sire Radevore (Generous). This is the Chain Store family of champions Al Bahathri and Haafhd, as well as the Gr.1 winner Lord Shanakill and this season's Oaks winner Forever Together, whose own sister topped this year's Goffs Orby sale, selling for a record €3.2 million.

RAINBOW BRIDGE kept his perfect formline intact with a record, come-from-behind victory in his first start as a four-year-old.

Switched to the extreme outside as they straightened up, Bernard Fayd'Herbe went to work on the strapping bay, who had to make up plenty of ground as last year's winner Our Mate Art and outsider New Caledonia scrapped it out up front. The latter gained the advantage inside the final furlong, but Rainbow Bridge was now in full cry and gaining fast, he collared the leader inside the final 50m before drawing off for a handy victory. A remarkable performance, considering that he had not raced since late May, yet managed to shave almost a second off the existing track record!

Yet to taste defeat in four starts, the gelding also completed a Gr.3 hat-trick, having accounted for the Winter Guineas/Classic double. Trainer Eric Sands has yet to get to the bottom of what is clearly a talented individual, who looks set to make his presence felt during the Cape summer season. Yet another fine advert for breeders Wilgerbosdrift and Mauritzfontein and the latter's resident stallion Ideal World, Rainbow Bridge was snapped up for R300,000 at the 2016 National Yearling Sale. He is the first foal of Jet Master's accomplished daughter Halfway To Heaven, whose seven career wins included both the Gr.3 Prix Du Cap and Listed Off To Stud Handicap. She foaled a filly to Silvano in 2017.

Returning from victory in Greyville's Listed Off To Stud Stakes in July, LOVE TO BOOGIE stepped up another gear to break through at Graded level in a thrilling blanket finish to this Gr.3 event. Sabine Plattner's five-year-old picked it up from long-time leader Red Ginger 200m out and quickly skipped a length clear. Despite coming under pressure from a flying Miss Katalin and last year's winner Goodtime Gal, she lasted long enough to take the honours by a fast diminishing neck from Miss Katalin, who completed a fine exacta for Drakenstein's former champion stallion Trippi. Sparingly raced - this was just her 11th lifetime start - victory here further enhanced Love To Boogie's already considerable broodmare value.

A R550,000 purchase from the 2015 National Yearling Sale, the bay was bred by Antony Peters from his accomplished sprinter Jalberry. Gr.1-placed and successful in both the Gr.3 Pretty Polly Stakes and Goldfields Sprint, the daughter of Jallad has proved equally as successful a broodmare. Trippi also features as the sire of her Zimbabwean Gr.3 winner On This Rock, she bred Gr.2 Durban Golden Horseshoe hero Purple Diamond to Var, Gr.2-placed Count Express to Count Dubois, while Jet Master gelding Mr Fantastic is a Gr.3-placed nine-time winner in Singapore.

From a live family, Jalberry is an own sister to last season's Equus Broodmare of the Year, Strawberry Lane, the dam of Western Winter's Gr.1 winning duo Solo Traveller and Redberry Lane.

Coming off a three-month rest, the Drakenstein-owned and bred CLOUDS UNFOLD was sharp enough to score a visually impressive victory in advance of the Cape Fillies Guineas. Notwithstanding the withdrawal of Mike de Kock's stakes winner Firdoas and undefeated Front And Centre, the line-up was a classy one.

Aldo Domeyer had Clouds Unfold within striking distance of the leaders and at the top of the straight, he angled the chestnut to the standside where she unwound her challenge. Favourite Temple Grafin hit the front approaching the final furlong, but patently had no answer to Cloud Unfold's powerful charge and she went on to score with the minimum of fuss.

The filly completed a fine hat-trick of wins here, having disposed of her male rivals in the Gr.3 Cape Nursery in her final juvenile start. Significantly, her winning time here was markedly faster than that recorded by the colt Twist Of Fate in the Cape Classic.

Candice Bass-Robinson, who was her Dad's assistant when Silver Mountain won this race before going on to win the Cape Guineas in 2015, remarked: *"We have always rated her and she has a lovely turn of foot. I think it will be straight into the Cape Fillies Guineas from here."* Defeated just once in five starts, this second success at Graded level took the filly's earnings to R483 125.

The Drakenstein homebred is by resident stallion What A Winter out of the Montjeu mare Montelissima, who was imported as a yearling together with her dam Issa. The Pivotal foal Issa was carrying at the time became Pivotal Pursuit, a Gr.2-placed winner of nine races. Issa went on to produce Summer Juvenile Stakes winner Arria to the cover of Antonius Pius, who

incidentally, is out of Issa's own sister, Gr.1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine Catchascatchcan.

The Cape Classic went the way of TWIST OF FATE, who likewise cemented his Guineas claims with a bloodless gun-to-tape victory.

The Joey Ramsden-trained colt quickly overcame the widest draw of all and led the way from the undefeated Sophomore Sprint winner Pleasedtomeetyou. Travelling comfortably on the lead as they turned for home, he always had the measure of his rivals and had the race in the bag approaching the final furlong. Unthreatened, he kept finding more to power home from favourite Cirillo, who could make no impression on the winner. The first winner sired by Master Of My Fate, the colt was also his young sire's first winner stakes winner when successful in the Listed Somerset 1200 in May. Twist Of Fate closed out his juvenile season when a fine third

in the Gr.1 Premier's Champion Stakes at Greyville. Horses don't know what they cost and with career earnings now standing at just over R440,000, the four-time winner has already made a mockery of the paltry R20,000 purchase price as a yearling.

Bred by the Favour Stud, he is out of Breeders Guineas winner Crescent Lily and hails from the immediate family of Durban July hero Heavy Metal and the Gr.1 winners Planetary Music and Drum Star.

Judpot's accomplished son CORAL FEVER defied top weight and the worst possible draw to register a last gasp victory in the Gr.2 Charity Mile at Turffontein over a distance short of his best.

The Robbie Sage trained chesnut turned for home near the back of the field, but switched to the outside, flashed his customary finishing toe to swoop on the line in a close finish, where a blanket could have covered the first four home.

Considering that the runner-up was in receipt of no less than 7.5 kg, this was a win full of credit for the Ascot Stud-bred winner, who shot to prominence when landing last season's Gr.1 Premier's Champions Challenge, that on the back of a facile score in Gr.2 Colorado King Stakes.

Coral Fever has earned owners Sylvia Vrska and Colin Bird over R4.1 million, a fine return on his R130,000 yearling price tag. The chestnut is one of four top level winners sired by Judpot and is out of the Rich Man's Gold mare Coral Tree, a dual winning half-sister to Gr.1 SA Derby hero and sire Ravishing (Jet Master), Gr.2 Betting World 1900 winner Dynastic Power (Dynasty) and the multiple Graded Stakes winner Red Badge (Badger Land).

Port Elizabeth trainer Yvette Bremner is no stranger to plundering Johannesburg feature races. She made that point in 2014 when Copper Parade upstaged champion Via Africa in the Gr.1 Computaform Sprint, whilst last year, Via Seattle shocked her Starling Stakes rivals at odds of 66-1.

Twelve months on, Yvette struck yet another blow for the Eastern Cape when her three-year-old NATIONAL PARK left a top field of rivals in tatters with an electrifying six-length romp in the Gr.3 Graham Beck Stakes.

Racing just off the pace, the three-year-old seized command fully 400m out and bid his rivals adieu. Favourite Chimichuri Run gave chase in vain, as the winner kept extending his advantage righ to the line

The newly-minted Stakes winner cracked his maiden third time out at two and has since won another three. It could have been four, as he won the Listed Champion Juvenile Cup, only to lose it in the boardroom.

A R240,000 National Sale graduate, National Park set up a fine double for his progressive young sire Gimmethegreenlight, with another three-year-old son Stream Ahead landing the Listed KZN Guineas Trial at Greyville 24 hours later.

Bred by co-owner Rob Knuppe's Missing U Syndicate, National Park is the most recent foal produced by six-time winning Camden Park mare Fancy Park.

Unraced since her fifth behind Celtic Sea in the Gr.2 Golden Slipper on July day, the three-year-old enjoyed a dream run up the centre to forge into the lead a furlong out and scooted home by just over two lengths from Nafaayes.

Yet to taste defeat at the Turffontein track, she dented some substantial reputations in the process, just as she had done when cracking her maiden in last season's Gr.2 SA Fillies. On that occasion, Ghaalla was 2.50 lengths behind her in second. Golden Slipper winner Celtic Sea never featured here and finished well back.

Ronnie's Candy is a daughter of King Of Kings, the widely-travelled English 2000 Guineas winner who died in 2015.

Gray bred his latest stakes winner from the Jet Master mare Bennie Andthe Jets. A three-time winner and second in the Gr.3 Jacaranda Handicap, she also produced Gr.3 Protea Stakes third Mogok Master (Mogok). The next dam, New Zealand-bred Franki Fourfingers, is an own sister to stakes-placed Australian galloper Desert Light and a half-sister to the dual New Zealand Stakes winner and classic performer, Light Opera (Straussbrook).

Vanessa Harrison's decision to keep her homebred SYLVAN ON FIRE in training at age five paid a handsome dividend when the daughter of Silvano rewarded her with a first stakes success. Relaxed after overcoming her wide draw, jockey Gavin Lerena had the timing honed to perfection and after joining Insignis and Beyond Approval a furlong out, she gradually got the better of her rivals close home and still had enough in the tank to hold off a late-charging Cold Cash by a neck. Now a five-time winner, the mare had earned small black type when third in the Gr.3 Acacia Handicap on March 3. She was not seen out again for seven months and only returned to action in the Joburg Spring Fillies & Mare Challenge, where despite spreading a shoe, she finished sixth, beaten less than three lengths.

Sylvan On Fire is a half-sister to Captain's Princess (Captain Al), who finished third behind Ronnie's Candy and Ghaalla in last season's Gr.2 SA Fillies Nursery. The pair are out of Syringa Handicap second Jet Flyer, a half-sister to Silvano's high-class son Silver Flyer. Winner of the Gr.2 Dingaans, he also ran second in the Gr.1 Cape Guineas and third in the Gr.1 SA Classic third. Jet Master, who featured as the broodmare sire of a treble of stakes winners on the day (he also sired the dams of Ronnie's Candy and the Golden Loom winner Rivarine) has enjoyed considerable success with this family, which traces to the Oppenheimers' blue hen mare Rising Trout. Grandam Fiery Flier is a half-sister to his daughters Love Is In The Air (Gr.1 Majorca Stakes), Gr.3 Pretty Polly winner Careful Landing and Cosmic Jet, who produced dual stakes winner Gimme The Stars to Gimmethegreenlight. Others from this family by the seven-time champion sire include Gr.3-placed stakes winners Jet Jamboree (The Darley Arabian) and Princessofthesky (Stormsvlei Mile).

Trainer Mike de Kock couldn't have asked for a better Summer Cup prep run from his boom filly TAKINGTHEPEACE, who registered a fluent victory under the Turffontein lights.

Despite an almost two-hour delay caused by rain and thunder, the daughter of Visionaire took no prisoners in the 1800m race. Settled in midfield as Cash Time made the pace up front, she slipped through on the inside and powered home by just under a length from the late-charging KZN challenger Sabina's Dynasty.

Now a six-time winner boasting earnings of just over R1,75 million, Takingthepeace was one of last season's top sophomore fillies, courtesy of victories in the Gr.1 SA Fillies Classic and Gr.2 Gauteng Fillies Guineas.

The four-year-old is out of talented Lisa Anne, whose string of Graded Stakes places includes a fine third in the Gr.1 Empress Club Stakes. The mare has a juvenile colt by Duke Of Marmalade and a yearling colt by Summerhill resident Willow Magic, a Gr.1 winning son of Dubawi.

KASIMIR fully justified favouritism with a facily victory here, his first at stakes level. Always prominent as Bold Respect and Sergeant Hardy disputed the pace up front, Justin Snaith's charge joined issue when shaken up by Richard Fourie at the furlong mark and was punched out to score by just over a length from Matchem Stakes runner-up New Caledonia.

It has been six years since Snaith saddled Cap Alright to victory in this sprint, prior to which he had won it with the mare Dance With Al in 2010. Remarkably, his trio of Merchants winners were all sired by Captain Al, who himself claimed the trophy in 2000.

A R1.2-million purchase from breeders Drakenstein Stud at the Cape Yearling Sale, Kasimir had already earned that plus interest, courtesy of his second behind Dutch Philip in last season's lucrative CTS1200. This victory, his fourth from 11 starts, pushed his earnings to just past the R1,7 million mark.

Kasimir is the second stakes winner out of Australian import Aquatint, whose previous foals include Gr.1 Golden Horseshoe hero Afrikaburn (Trippi) and Gr.2-placed The Slade (Philanthropist). Grandam Sakieh is a daughter Sigy (Habitat), the champion French juvenile whose career-high victory came in the Gr.1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp.

Trainer Vaughan Marshall is set to bid for a unique hat-trick in the Gr.1 Cape Guineas with his unbeaten charge ONE WORLD, who took his perfect record to five in this classic prep previously known as the Selangor Cup.

Marshall has saddled the last two Guineas winners, William Longsword and Tap O'Noth and like One World, they are by Captain Al, who himself won the classic for Marshall way back in 1999.

Allowed to dictate from 1000m out, the long-striding colt looked set for yet another facile victory, however he came under mild pressure from Sean Tarry's Chimichuri Run and was driven out to take the mile race by a half-length.

This was the first success at Graded level for the Klawervlei-bred, who had signed off on his juvenile season with a five-length romp in the Listed Langerman over 1500m.

One World cost R425,000 at the Cape Premier Yearling Sale and is out of English-bred Aquilonia (Giant's Causeway). Prior to her arrival in South Africa, she had produced Russian 1000 Guineas winner Glorious Lass to the cover of Galileo, while her local foals also include Stakes-placed filly Count To Ten (Count Dubois). Grandam Leonila (Caerleon) placed at Gr.2 and Gr.3 level in France and is an own sister to French Oaks victress Caerlina, who in turn bred Irish and French 1000 Guineas third, La Nuit Rose (Rainbow Quest).

Fresh off a debut maiden win, HAWWAAM made the leap to Graded stakes winner in one fell swoop when he annihilated a classy field of fellow sophomores in breathtaking fashion.

Patiently ridden from a poor draw, Sheikh Hamdan's bay cornered second last as long-time leader National Park brought them into the straight. Set alight by Gavin Lerena, he sliced his way through the field, surged past Thanksgiving inside the final furlong and exploded away to score by an increasing margin.

Hawwaam had made a winning debut just three weeks earlier and the manner of this smashing performance suggests he is a colt of infinite promise.

A R1-million purchase at the 2017 National Yearling Sale, Hawwaam is the 78th locally-bred stakes winner sired by reigning champion sire Silvano. More significant, he is the second foal out of Gr.3 winner Halfway To Heaven, who has made a sensational start to her broodmare career to say the least. Her first foal is none other than unbeaten triple Gr.3 winner and current Met favourite Rainbow Bridge (Ideal World).

Trainer Mike de Kock remarked: *"He's a horse that brings his good work to the racetrack, he has plenty of ability and we've always rated him. We'd like to look at the Gr 1 Cape Guineas next."* The December 15 classic could prove to be a race for the ages, for lying in wait is unbeaten local favourite and Gr.2 Concorde Cup hero, One World, as well as Sean Tarry's Cirillo, who was hugely impressive when making all in the CTS Ready To Run Stakes from a horrible 18 draw.

Sheikh Hamdan's silks were again to the fore in the Gr.3 Fillies Mile with GHAALLA making it a quickfire Graded double, albeit that she had to work a bit harder for victory than her stable companion in the preceding Dingaans.

Contested after a substantial delay caused by a thunder storm, the Var filly came storming into the lead a furlong out but immediately came under pressure from rank outsider I Like It. The duo toughed it out to the line, with Ghaalla getting the verdict by a shorthead, while the gallant runner-up was followed home by a fast-finishing Ronnie's Candy.

For Ghaalla it was a deserved first stakes success as well as sweet revenge over old nemesis Ronnie's Candy. She chased home St John Gray's chestnut in last season's Gr.2 Fillies Nursery and again had to bow to the chestnut when third in the Gr.3 Starling Stakes on November 3. The R5-million sales topper at the 2017 National Yearling Sale, Ghaalla is a third generation Varsfontein-bred and boasts a power-packed female line. She is the first foal of Captain Al mare Fidelity, a winning daughter of champion Promisefrommyheart (Elliodor), also the dam of promising young stallion Master Of My Fate. Third dam Secret Pact (Bush Telegraph), a stakes winning own sister to Horse of the Year London News, also bred Gr.1 Majorca Stakes victress Covenant and Stakes winner Secret Heart, the dam of Breeders Cup Juvenile Turf hero Pluck.

TILBURY FORT took his career to a new high when he came with a block-buster late charge to register a first stakes success, his victory capping a banner day for trainer Sean Tarry, who saddled no less than six winners on the card.

The son of Horse Chestnut came from way off the pace and kicked into gear close home to sweep past Dawn Assault and favourite Cascapedia for a widening half-length score.

A changed horse after being gelded in January, this was the five-year-old's third and most lucrative victory since and came on the back of an agonising shorthead defeat in last month's Charity Mile. He is the third Gr.1 winner for his late sire, who stood at Claiborne Farm until his return to South Africa in 2009. The former Horse of the Year died in 2015.

Tilbury Fort was bred by Geoff Armitage at the family's Sandown Stud and is out of Colleen, a stakesplaced seven-time winner. A half-sister to stakes-placed Lanate (Northfields), the pair are out of Rapunzelle, an own sister to Gr.3-placed Saybrooke and a half-sister to Debutante victress Family Code (Del Sarto; dam of Gr.3 winner Ethics (Count Dubois). Third dam Cradle Days is a stakesplaced half-sister to Strelitzia and Sceptre Stakes queen Wedding Guest and to Gr.3 winner and SA Oaks runner-up Jamaican Princess.

Sheik Hamdan's NAFAAYES became the latest stakes winner for her owner with a smooth victory in the Gr.2 Ipi Tombe Challenge, the race named in honour of her former stable companion. The Australian-bred three-year-old tracked Gr.1 winner Redberry Lane into the straight and after delivering the knockout punch fully 500m out, she cruised home by the best part of three lengths. Undefeated in both starts at two, Mike de Kock's talented charge ran third in her seasonal debut before chasing home Ronnie's Candy in the Gr.3 Starling Stakes.

Bred by Kia Ora Stud, Nafaayes is the latest stakes winner sired by Danehill's champion son Exceed And Excel. She is out of triple American Stakes winner Decelerator, whose career-best effort came in the Gr.3 Debutante Stakes. Grandam Paris Rose is a half-sister to Gr.1 Test Stakes victress Fabulously Fast (Deputy Minister) and to the dam of Gr.1 Malibu Stakes winner City Of Light (Quality Road). Third dam Fabulous Notion won the Gr.1 Santa Susanna Stakes and is a half-sister to Gr.1 Turf Classic hero and Epsom Derby third, Cacoethes (Alydar).

This was a timely return to stakes success for the winner, who hadwon the Gr.3 Byerley Turk at three. With this, his seventh victory Africa Rising padded an already sizable bankroll to R1,449,500, a fine return on the R625,000 he cost Chris van Niekerk at the 2015 Johannesburg Ready To Run Sale. From the second crop of former Summerhill stallion Visionaire, he is out of of Sucha Looka, a half-sister to stakes winning stayers Charisma (Salaadim) and Stud Master (Desert Team). This is the family of Gr1 Administrator's Classic winner Last Watch, Gr1 Natal Oaks winner Spring Wonder and Oaks Trial winner and SA Oaks runner-up Salutation.

It was a case of deja vu for Cape Town owner Geoff van Lear, whose homebred SCHIPPERS gained her first stakes victory without turning much of a hair. In 2010, her dam Fair Rosalind had carried his silks to victory in this exact same race!

As predicted, Kissable barreled out of the gates to set a strong pace, while Gavin Lerena had Schippers nicely covered up. Ouro joined the leader up front going through the furlong mark, but neither had an answer to the strong surge from Schiffer, who closed relentlessly and scooted home to win by daylight.

Geoff Woodruff's latest stakes winner seldom puts a foot wrong and has finished out of the first four just twice in 11 starts. With relatively few miles on the clock, she is unlikely to stop here and could well have the Gr.1 SA Fillies Sprint as a long-term target.

The filly's victory added to a red-letter day for breeder James Armitage, as both she and Summer Cup hero Tilbury Fort were foaled and raised at his Sandown Stud.

Schippers' dam Fair Rosalind is a daughter of American-bred For Rosalind, who scored five times in the Beck colours and also finished second in the Listed Ladies Mile. The next dam Alyette is an unraced half-sister to champion Canadian juvenile Talkin Man (With Approval), who crossed the border to capture both the Gotham and Wood Memorial Stakes.
